I am very pleased to share this update on the Star & Crescent Alumni Association, the landlord and a support system for the Delta-Rho Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity.

We are transitioning out of one of the most dynamic periods in our chapter's proud 91-year history at F&M:

- The long (and very involved) search for a new home
- The establishment of the Kappa Sigma Delta-Rho Educational Foundation and a successful \$500,000+ campaign for the new house
- The financing, City approval, and logistics involved in construction and relocation
- The transition into a new living space (and the challenges of 'growing into' a new home)
- A continually raising bar on undergraduate expectations and conduct by the College, the Commonwealth of PA and the International Fraternity.

Balanced against personal bandwidth, this caused us to not follow-through on our commitment to 'share the good news' with your alumni. For that, I do apologize. We are into the 'post move' period and embracing a new normal... one which will allow us to improve in this area.

To that end, and to get you caught up, after a period of adjustment, the chapter has adopted and implemented a series of protocols designed to maintain 441 College Avenue as the first in class fraternity house at F&M. I must stop here to acknowledge our Treasurer, Tom Reid, '76. Tom identified a need for adult/ professional oversight of the property management function. But, he did more than that.

For 15 months before and after the 2018-2019 academic year, Tom moved from Colorado to the Phil Schreiber Memorial Library at 441 College Avenue and provided critical on-site leadership to help the

chapter embrace ownership of its house maintenance responsibilities. I have studied our chapter's evolution pretty thoroughly and can say with confidence that this is the single most significant act of volunteer service in Delta-Rho history. When you next see Tom, or have a minute to reach out (treid@certifiedksolutions.com), I encourage you to express your appreciation.

Leading up Tom's arrival, and in addition to what I'll term a 'lack of excellence' in the maintenance of the house, the chapter committed some alcohol-related infractions (alcohol at a recruitment event, then an unregistrered social event while on probation) which resulted in a yearlong alcohol ban (from the College and the Fraternity), a \$5,000 fine (from the Fraternity) and a series of wellthought out requirements (from the College) designed to raise its performance to a superior level in the areas of community service, risk management, Ritual Proficiency and leadership development.

The chapter entered the 2019-2020 academic year with 53 brothers, adding four upperclassmen his fall. They are now gearing up for spring rush with a target of 15-20 more brothers. I have confidence that they'll get there.

Dear Brothers,

Since exceeding several College expectations during 2018-2019 academic year (see elsewhere in this newsletter), Delta-Rho entered the fall semester with a great spirit of optimism. These last few months of my term as Grand Master has seen the Delta-Rho Brotherhood at its very finest. A strong catalyst in Delta-Rho's position at the leading fraternity at F&M has been our fellow 'in-house' brother and Alumni Treasurer Tom Reid. Through his leadership and very high standards, Delta-Rho is now referred to by the College as the 'model house.'

Last July, members of our Executive Board made the trek to Charlottesville, VA for Kappa Sigma's Grand Conclave and 150th Anniversary. The experience was unmatched as we were able to soak in the great history of our brotherhood. Through the excellent leadership programs and valuable lessons learned, we felt extremely confident in our abilities to keep the Chapter moving forward. The enthusiasm and experience rubbed of on the brotherhood as we shared what we had enjoyed.

In addition to new changes in upkeeping of the house, there have been changes in the way we run our brotherhood. We have reestablished boards and committees that help delegate the responsibility of the chapter and better help us operate. This new separation of power has created a greater involvement in our Delta-Rho Chapter.

The number of individuals joining Greek organizations has been on the decline over recent semesters. Despite that, the chapter has seen an increase each semester for the past three semesters for the number of initiates. This includes this fall where we listed the second largest group of pledges who are now new brothers. The pipeline for new pledges this coming spring is even stronger, and we plan to see a large class in the spring.

Our relationship with administration has not been stronger. Our executive board has solid ties with the Dean of Students and additionally the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life (OFSL). In addition, the Administration has embraced our input during the recent search for a new OFSL Director, and we will develop a strong relationship with that individual, once hired.

Furthermore, the practice of the Kappa Sigma Ritual has become a main focus for the chapter. We have increased our standards to ensure every brother holds one level of Ritual Proficiency to better themselves as a Kappa Sigma. We also have brothers furthering their involvement and practicing in additional levels of Ritual Proficiency. The participation in our creed has not been this high since my time as a pledge.

Delta-Rho continues to participate in community events and stay active in Lancaster through philanthropy and other involvements. Community service highlights over the past year include: Military/First Responders Appreciation (enjoying pizza with F&M Public Safety); youth Kickball (Wharton Elementary School playing with students from prekindergarden to fifth grade), Kappa Delta Sorority 'White Rose Bowl' Flag Football Champions (benefitting SeriousFun Children's Network and Prevent Child Abuse America (PCAA)), the Annual Cancer Relay for Life and, most recently, co-presenting our Annual Haunted House with Chi-Omega Sorority, welcoming in hundreds of local kids. Additionally, we are a leading advocate for stronger Greek involvement in the F&M and Lancaster communities.

As we approach a transition in the executive board, I, along with our chapter, have full confidence that the incoming officers will continue to perform their duties to the best of their ability and continue to keep this Delta-Rho Chapter of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity healthy and an example for others on campus.



STATE OF THE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

In the rear-view mirror, I am amazed at how willingly so many of you stepped forward to make a financial commitment to the monumental **Tradition Continues Campaign**, which solidified Delta-Rho's housing facilities for decades to come. And, I especially thank the 40 or 50 of you who stepped forward to marshal your class and others through calls, emails, nudging, harassment, etc.

At the end of the day, we secured \$590,000 in campaign commitments. \$535,000 of this is in hand, with much of the remaining \$55,000 on target to arrive before it is all over. No fraternity fundraising effort at F&M has raised even half this much... **Pride in the Order!**

We are now transitioning out of our major capital campaign an into a new KSDREF Annual Fund paradigm, to facilitate direct support of our undergraduate brothers through scholarships and grants to help them attend Kappa Sigma and other national leadership development conferences. The impact of the latter on inspiring and evolving our brothers as leaders is substantial, as Grand Master Kyle Busher attests in his State of the Chapter report. In addition, we will continue to invest in our facility by approving periodic educational housing grants, for improvements and maintenance of 441 College Avenue.

Most importantly, shifting out of the campaign is helping us expand to opportunities to be formally involved in the Foundation's leadership. At our Annual Meeting in October, we elected the following Brothers as new Directors, joining me, VP Rick Schottenfeld, '82, and Treasurer Tom Reid, '76:

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Star & Crescent Alumni Chapter of Franklin & Marshall College was chartered in the 1930, to facilitate the purchase of Delta-Rho Chapter's first home. "It has been doing business as the Kappa Sigma Star & Crescent Alumni Association since the late 1980s." The chapter had rented several different properties since before its chartering into the Kappa Sigma Fraternity in 1928. 249 N. Charlotte Street served as Delta-Rho's home for most of its proud history, from 1960 – 2016.

The Alumni Association is an IRS-designated 501(c) (7) tax-exempt organization. The Association's principal asset is the current Chapter House and furnishings, with a book value of approximately \$1.35 million and a insurance replacement cost of \$1.6 million. Against this asset is a mortgage loan from Fulton Bank, with a present balance of \$645,000; Franklin & Marshall serves is a co-signer on this note.

Since the move in at the end of 2016, I mark 2019-2020 as the first year of a new normal, as we've now largely/finally fully 'moved in' to our new home. Undergraduate rent, parlor and maintenance fees provide the lion's share (just shy of \$150,000) of the Association's annual budgeted income. We budget for 12 of the 14 individual beds being filled; since opening three years ago, we've only had a single vacancy (and for just one semester). Direct contributions and grants comprise the remaining \$15,000 of the Association's annual income.

The largest expense, for the foreseeable future, is Fulton debt service of \$4,240 monthly or \$50,880 each year through 2037. Other principal expenses include taxes (\$15,000), insurance (\$15,500), utilities (\$8,000) and landscaping (\$4,000). We are on track to end the year with a \$22,500 surplus hich will form the nucleus of a long-term capital operating reserve. While it strained our cash flow from time to time, we made significant improvements to the house over the past year that included, among other things:

- New trophy cabinet in game room
- Freezer, garbage disposal, pot racks, and new stove hood in the kitchen
- Exterior lawn rehabilitation, plantings for ground cover, new bushes, and new decorative fencing in the front.
- Mold remediation in the basement
- External faucet for outdoor cleaning and lawn maintenance
- New air conditioning unit for the basement
- Solving a basement drainage issue
- Bathroom improvements including soap and towel dispensers
- New protective Lexan over stained glass on front door
- New library furnishings
- New security cameras
- Fireplace inserts

The Kappa Sigma Delta-Rho Educational Foundation was created in 2015 as an IRS-designated 501(c)(3) charitable organization, separate from the Association. The two organizations are related entities. The principal role of the Foundation up until now was to secure alumni contributions in order to make educational housing grants to the Alumni Association. As this function is largely fulfilled, the Foundation is now turning its attention to additionally raising funds for undergraduate leadership conference attendance and scholarships.
